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AdA International Basic

This Dual Vocational Training gives the participants or new trainers the competency in accordance with the German System which leads to extraordinary productivity and innovation skills.

The training specifies how vocational and professional skills can be combined with activity-based and process-oriented content. It aims to develop and encourage individual occupational expertise, as well as a flexible adaptation to constant change of working environment.

The training brings out trainers who are specially qualified for their assignment and eligibility for their operational practice. This is being certified by an objective examination.

The AdA International Basic Training involves 4 Steps:

Trainer Prerequisites

The AdA training of trainers is the ideal training for all professionals who want to pass on theoretical know-how and practical knowledge to trainees as an instructor. If you have already completed vocational training in the commercial, technical or service field and have pedagogical skills, you have the best qualifications for the training of trainers.

Trainers must have the necessary technical knowledge, but also acquire organizational, educational, psychological and legal knowledge. You can already complete the training without special prior knowledge. After passing the AHK exam, you will then have the training qualification.

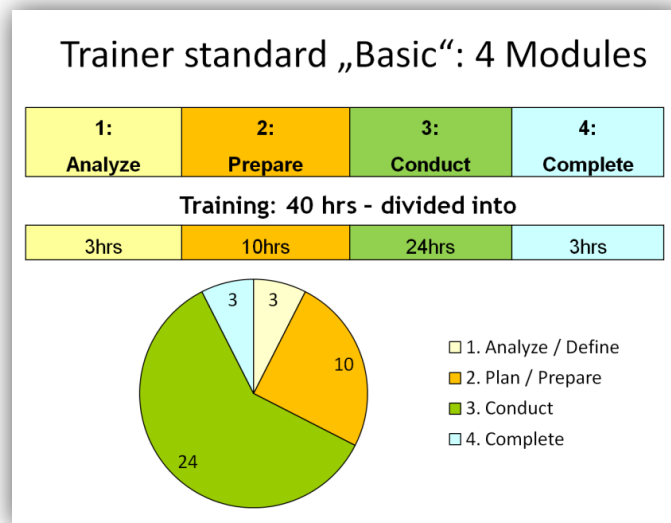
Dates, location, duration

Number of hours of instruction and timetable

According to the German standard the training covers 4 modules:



The modules are covered within a specific timetable as:

Day	Topic	Module/hrs
1 morning	Beginning – 1 st presentation	5
afternoon	Work place analysis, identify work tasks/processes, requirements	3
2 morning	Check – discuss – define concrete steps -> transfer	2
afternoon	Goals – action ability – didactic -> presentations	6
3 morning	Planning: Goals – content – methods - places	4
afternoon	Presentations: Methods and media	4
4 morning	Planning: Cooperation	4
afternoon	Social/personal development - > transfer and presentation	4
5 morning	Transfer (Learning accesses), examination, certification	3
afternoon	Control/evaluation of development	5

Discussion in plenum and in working groups

Presentations by every participant

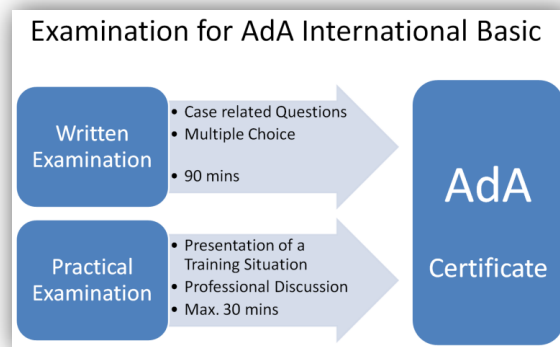
Specific and personal feedback – by trainer and by co-learners



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Examination Process

The final examination is organized by the AHK (or equivalent host), composed by



The written examination is defined by questions which are given by the DIHK (DIHK-Gesellschaft für berufliche Bildung - Organisation zur Förderung der IHK-Weiterbildung mbH).

As we are not focusing on technical knowledge and competencies we do not need specific software licenses and technical equipment. A personal smartphone and an internet access could be helpful.

The organizing party (as AHK i.e.) defines any tuition fees or examination fees - as well as the purchase of learning materials (e.g. books). Our recommendation is to use the material which the DIHK provides.

The terms and conditions of payment will be agreed in the specific contract between organizing party and the trainer – the same as cancellation, withdrawal and refund policies. The trainer will use a specific feedback sheet with specific questions so that we get an effective feedback about the training and the trainer. Participants requests, suggestions and complaints will be carefully analyzed and taken into consideration for the next training project.
